

OUR 6 POINT PLAN AND THE 2022 BUDGET

Our 6 Point Plan	Our response to the Budget announcement
1. Two days a week of funded early education and care for all children from birth to school	Preschool funding welcomed. Recent measures to remove the subsidy cap to increase affordability for families are a start but much more work needed
2. A commitment to the inclusion of all children	Nothing specific in the budget to address unmet demand in inclusion in education and care
3. Mandatory National Quality Standard assessments and ratings at least every three years	Nothing in the budget to support more regular quality assessments in ECEC
4. The creation of a national industrial instrument for the education and care sector to provide educators with fairer levels of pay	Short-term cost of living measures will support educators, but broader issue of wages is unaddressed
5. A National Children's Education & Care Workforce Strategy	No funding for the Government's strategy measures. Extension of apprenticeship payments and rebates for employers are helpful
6. Properly funded infrastructure and governance support	Good to see commitment to more services where they are needed, but overall inadequate response. Much more is needed including a coordinated approach to planning.
